Notes From the Field



Hi folks!

We're rolling into August and, with the new month, some cooler weather. Mornings are even a little (dare I say?) chilly! It's funny how quickly the weather can shift, but we are certainly not complaining. You can see this change in the field, too; this month, we're planting cool weather crops again, like radishes, turnips, and arugula. But don't fear! Our summer crops are still growing like mad-the high tunnel tomatoes are so tall that we need a ladder now when trellising! We're also working on getting an efficient compost system started.

We filled our compost infrastructure (which we built with a volunteer group in May) with a ratio of 2:2:1 of green material, brown material, and manure from Avery's roommate Haley at Natick Community Organic Farm. Now, we're waiting for it to get hot (hotter than 131 degrees Fahrenheit) and stay hot for 3 days before turning it and repeating the process. On Friday, the compost pile reached

that threshold temperature, which was very exciting for us. It means there are microbes and bacteria present in the compost pile, eating and decomposing the material and releasing heat as a by-product of respiration. Respiration is the name of the chemical process in which sugars are broken down into energy. In the case of a compost pile, those sugars are coming from the material we put into the compost.

Hopefully soon, we'll be producing our own compost, chock full of beneficial microbacteria and nutrients for our soil!
